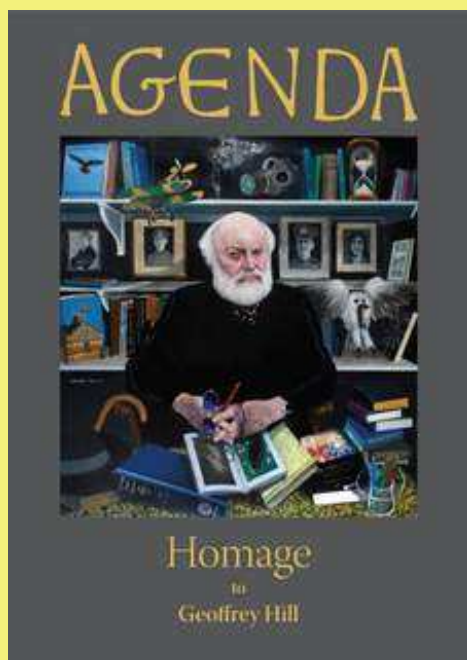

It contains a section, 'Homage' with poems, elegies, prose pieces, reminiscences and memoirs by such well-known poets as Stephen Romer, David Harsent, Clive Wilmer, William Bedford, Peter Carpenter, Peter Dale, Andrew McNeillie and others. A moving obit by WS Milne heads the issue and Keith Grant's portrait graces the cover.

This issue also contains strong poems by established, little-known and new voices which make up a refreshing anthology, as well as three essays.

There will be a general anthology of poems (on no particular themes), two chosen young poets and reviews/essays.

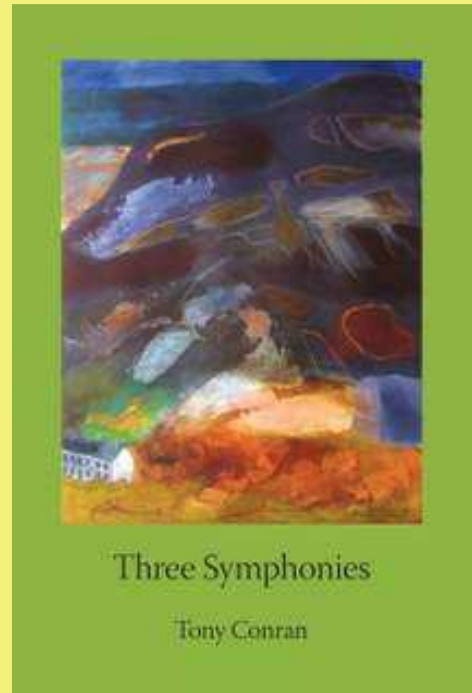

There will be a special T S Eliot issue in the spring 2017, to celebrate the recently published Poems of T S Eliot *Vol I: Collected and Uncollected Poems* (1,344 pp, Faber & Faber) and *Vol II Practical Cats & Further Verses* (688pp). These are edited by Christopher Ricks and Jim McCue who provide an enthralling and enlightening commentary. This special Eliot issue of *Agenda* will include a previously unpublished essay by Jim McCue as well as essays on original angles regarding Eliot's output. It will tie in with a much older T S Eliot issue of *Agenda* (Vol. 23 Nos. 1-2 spring –summer 1985), a few copies of which still remain for those interested.
